Cost of Keeping a Dog/Cat

You will need to buy food, toys and other things for your pet. It needs to see an animal doctor (vet) too. The average cost of owning a dog or cat will be at least \$2,700 for the first year!




Basic Pet Care - Dog

- Ensure dog is micro-chipped
- License dog with AVS
- Leash dog when out of house
- Pick up after the dog poos
- Attend obedience training


Basic Pet Care - Cat

- Keep cat strictly indoors
- Mesh windows and gate
- Provide lots of stimulation at home to keep them entertained – scratching post, toys, etc.



Basic Pet Care - Rabbit

- Feed the correct diet
- Do not carry them by their ears
- Rabbits can be toilet-trained
- Keep them in playpens
- Does not need water bath




Basic Pet Care - Hamster

- Clean cage at least once a week
- Wash hands before handling; hamsters have poor eyesight
- Requires gentle handling
- Should be kept separately



Basic Pet Care - Red-Eared Slider

- Requires a big space (they grow up to 30cm in length!)
- Feed the best quality pellets you can provide
- Requires daily water change (if no filtration system)
- Carries salmonella bacteria; wash your hands thoroughly after handling it.



Being a Responsible Pet Owner


STERILISE YOUR PET

- Sterilisation (removal of an animal's reproductive organs) prevents your pet from having baby animals. Although baby animals may be cute, they can cause problems like:
 - Overcrowding
 - Lack of resources (food, medical, care, etc.)
 - Potential abandonment



Being a Responsible Pet Owner

- Vaccinate your pet
 - Vaccinate your cat and dog to prevent them from catching certain deadly diseases which are preventable. Vaccinations are done annually.



Being a Responsible Pet Owner

LISTEN TO YOUR VET

- Bring your pet to the vet for regular check-ups, and when it is sick.
- Do not give your pet leftover medication.
- Follow the vet's instructions



Being a Responsible Pet Owner

KEEP SINGAPORE RABIES-FREE


- Rabies is a deadly disease that can spread from infected animals to us. Protect your pet, yourself, and the community by:
 - Getting your pet from reliable sources, like an adoption shelter
 - Calling your vet if you think your pet is sick
 - Avoid touching stray and wild animals if overseas



Being Considerate to the Community

Some people are scared of animals. Think about others and be considerate of your actions:

- Keep your cat indoors. Do not allow it to roam outside your house.
- Keep your dog on a leash.
- Pick up after your dog during walks to keep the place clean.
- Only bring your pet to places that pets can go, like most parks.




Carry a bottle of water to rinse/dilute the urine if your dog pees on the concrete ground/wall columns.

Community (Stray) Animals

Be considerate towards community (stray) animals by:

- Giving them space
- Not making loud noises or moving suddenly. This might scare them.



Did you know! Sometimes, a friendly stray cat may come forward and do a roll-over or rub its face on your legs: that is a sign of affection. If you do not like it, slowly move away.



Understanding Dog Behaviour

- Friendly

Body relaxed, with mouth slightly open and tongue showing. Tail is wagging.



- Defensive

Dog stares with mouth drawn back, showing teeth. May bark or growl.




Understanding Cat Behaviour

- Friendly
Body relaxed, tail up. May brush against your legs or lean towards you.



- Defensive
Cat stares with ears flat against head. Tail will be low and close to body. May hiss.

Wild animals should not be kept as pets. Here's why:


Bad for animals

Wild animals need special care. It is cruel if you cannot provide them with what they need.




Bad for you

- Mesh windows and gate

Clean cage at least once a week!




How big can a red-eared slider terrapin grow up to?
