

## PLANTS THAT CONTAIN CONTROLLED DRUGS

There are plants and their derivatives that contain controlled drugs and are thus illegal under Singapore's Misuse of Drugs Act. They include:

2.	Opium poppy <sup>2</sup> 	Any plant of the species <i>Papaver somniferum</i>	Opium, Morphine, Heroin, Thebaine and Codeine
