What We Do

Phytosanitary Certification Services

The National Parks Board (NParks) is the National Plant Protection Organisation (NPPO) of Singapore.

NParks conducts phytosanitary inspections and issues around 12,000 phytosanitary certificates annually. This ensures that plants and plant products in our export trade are free from harmful pests.

Export of commodities such as spices, food produce, cocoa products, aquatic plants, cut flowers, foliage and other plant products is facilitated through these phytosanitary certification services.



Post Entry Inspection

NParks is committed to protecting our local flora from the negative impact of exotic and emerging indigenous plant pests and diseases.

Through a robust science-based regulatory system, we aim to protect the sustainability and diversity of our urban landscape.

Our comprehensive plant health programme, comprising import regulation and inspection, as well as laboratory testing and surveillance, has successfully kept Singapore free from harmful quarantine pests and diseases.

NParks conducts about 5,000 post-entry inspections per year to ensure that our imports are pest-free and comply with import health requirements.

Agri-Trade Facilitation

NParks facilitates trade and maintains close ties with the global community in a spirit of exchange and cooperation.

NParks offers the following accreditation schemes to traders of plant and plant products: the Assurance Certification Scheme (ACS), Treatment Provider Scheme (TPS) and Bio-Security Assurance Arrangement (BSAA).

These schemes are created to facilitate safe import and export trade of plants, plant products, insects and microorganisms.
