Antibiotics do not cure all infections. The misuse or overuse of antibiotics in animals can contribute to antimicrobial resistance in the population and environment.



How does antimicrobial resistance concern us?

Superbugs may develop when bacteria adapt to become resistant to antibiotics.

They may cause life-threatening and treatment-resistant infections, which can be transmitted between animals, people and the environment.
