- Shape a child's character and attitudes through experiential learning in their immediate outdoor setting

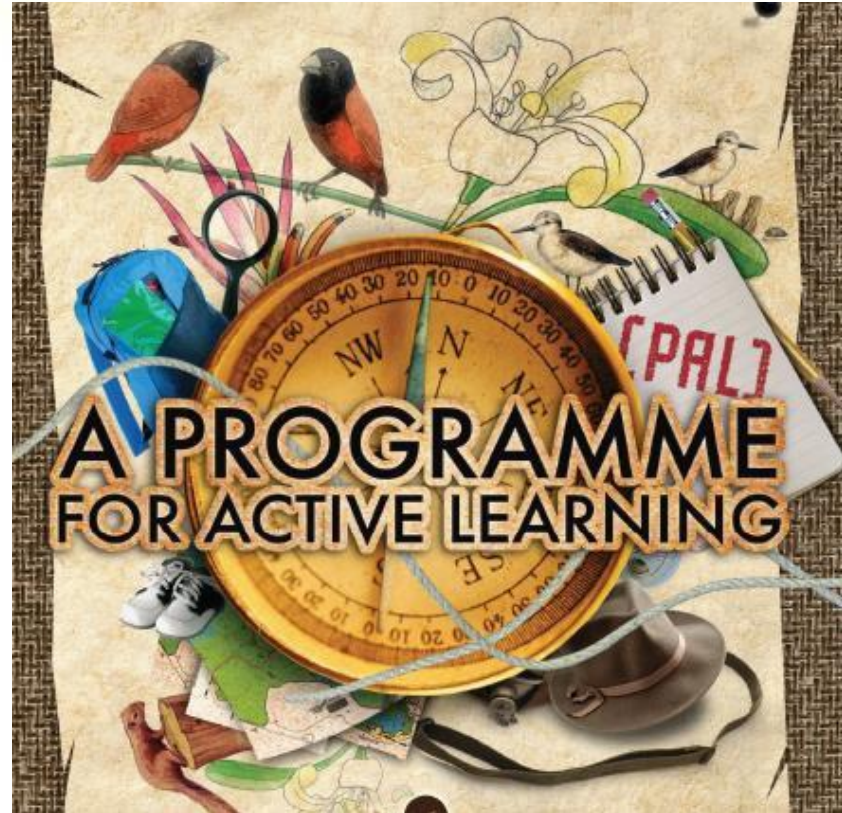

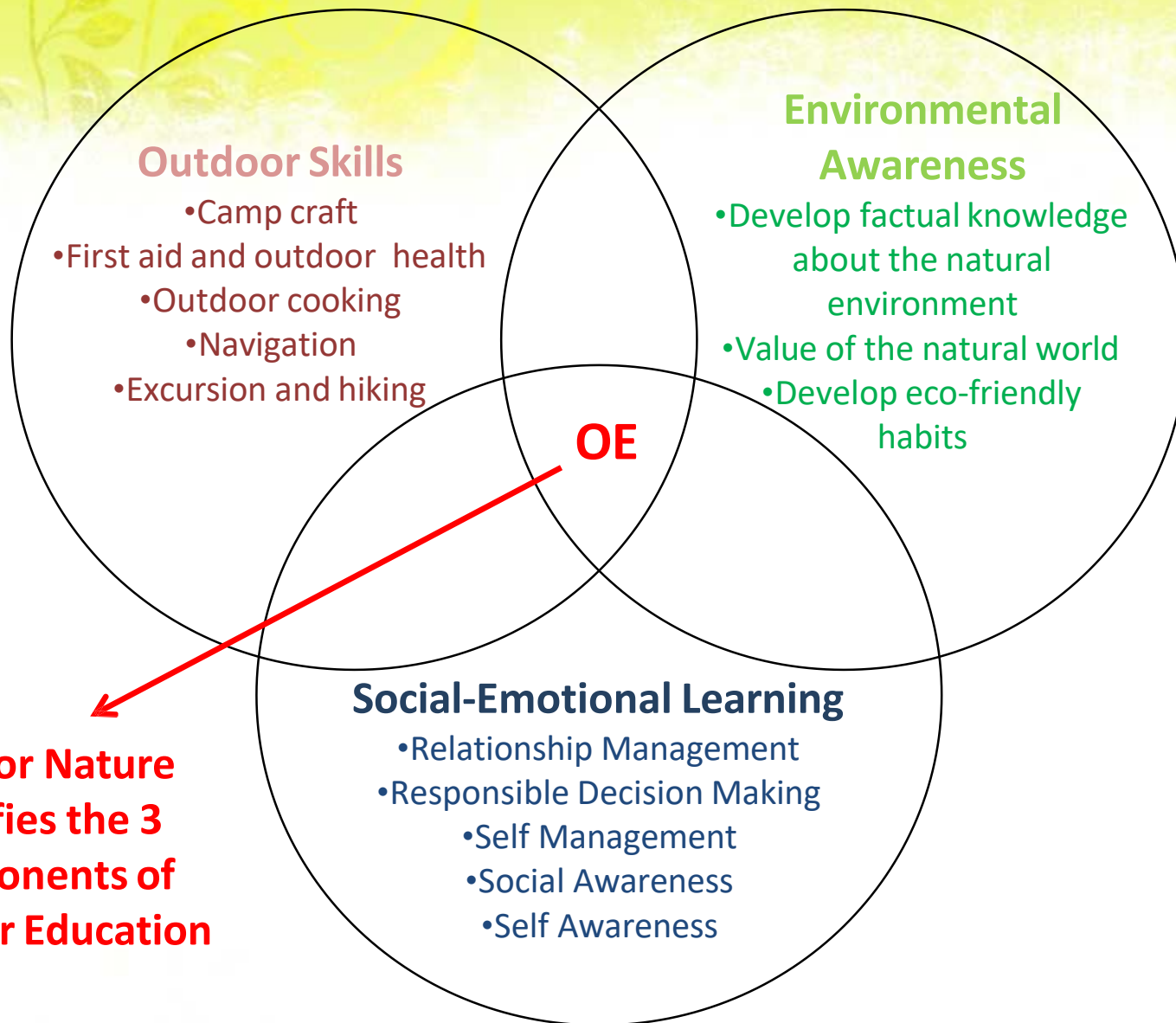
