For projects that are listed as "Walk on me", these projects are fully accessible to the public.

At each site do remember to take nothing but photos, leave nothing but footprints!

#### DIFFICULTY OF TRAIL

The trails are of easy to moderate levels. You may alight at the nearest MRT station and walk (unless stated otherwise) to the various projects listed

#### **ESTIMATED TIME OF COMPLETION OF THIS TRAIL**

You will take about 2–4 hours to complete this trail. It is possible to complete all projects on foot within this time frame, excluding viewing time at each site.


### WHAT IS SKYRISE GREENERY?

Skyrise Greenery is a term coined in Singapore that refers to the greening of both horizontal (rooftop greenery) and vertical (green walls) dimensions.

These installations can be spotted all around Singapore in various forms such as sky terraces, balcony planters, green roofs, rooftop gardens and different types of green walls.

## WHY IS SKYRISE GREENING NECESSARY?

In our heavily built-up city-state with limited land, skyrise greenery helps to create a harmonious balance between urban development and our natural heritage. It also helps reduce the Urban Heat Island effect, making Singapore a more liveable place.

#### 01. MINISTRY OF MANPOWER (HAVELOCK ROAD)





Vertical greenery comprising various segments of free-standing panels line the main corridor at the ground level of this building. It provides a form of green relief for pedestrians and motorists as they travel through the city.

#### **02. CLARKE QUAY CENTRAL**





Demonstrating that green walls are not limited to outdoor spaces, strips of vertical greenery enliven the indoor drop-off point located at the basement level of the mall.

#### 03. 50 NORTH CANAL ROAD





This vertical greenery integrates beautifully with the geometrically shaped design of the building façade, proving that green walls can be artistic as well as soothing.

#### 04. PARKROYAL ON PICKERING







Winner of the Skyrise Greenery Awards 2013, this development was designed to be a hotel and office in a garden. Rooftop greenery in the form of planters along the edges of the façade of the building can be seen from street level. Though there are several rooftop gardens located at different levels, access to these gardens are only for hotel guests. But the public is able to view the vertical greenery along the lobby leading towards the restaurant on the first floor.

#### **05. OCEAN FINANCIAL CENTRE**





One of the winners of the Excellence Awards for the Skyrise Greenery Awards 2013, this unique vertical greenery installation uses different plant species to depict maps of Singapore, Southeast Asia, and other parts of the world. It is cladded on the facade of the multistorey carpark.

#### 06. 6 BATTERY ROAD





Named "Rainforest Rhapsody", this colourful indoor vertical greenery aims to mimic plant growth patterns on tree branches and rocks in rainforests. It received an honourable mention in the Skyrise Greenery Awards 2011 and is sited at the lobby of this building.

#### **07. NATIONAL GALLERY SINGAPORE**







This lush rooftop garden, which houses an outdoor event area and other amenities, can be found at the two topmost floors of the former City Hall. It transforms the rooftop of this historical building into a green oasis. Another two extensive stretches of vertical greenery can be found inside the former Supreme Court and City Hall blocks.

#### **08. THE PATINA, CAPITOL SINGAPORE**





This vibrant and lush span of vertical greenery is designed to welcome guests of the hotel as they enter through the driveway towards the hotel lobby.
