LEASHING AND MUZZLING YOUR DOG

Pet owners are required by law to leash your dog in public places. The maximum fine for not leashing your dog is \$5,000. Leashing the dog is part of being a responsible pet owner. You can better control the dog and avoid it from getting lost or from disturbing others unintentionally.



Dog breeds specified in the ¹Second Schedule of the Animals and Birds (Dog Licensing and Control) Rules must be muzzled in public. The maximum fine for not doing so is \$5,000 for the first offence, and a fine not exceeding \$10,000 for the second or subsequent conviction.
