Pigeons are common in Singapore.

They are a problem because their droppings stain homes and public amenities. They can also spread diseases to humans through contaminated droppings or via contact with diseased birds. These diseases affect those with lower immunity.

WHAT YOU CAN DO:




Cover all open-top rubbish bins in your premises properly to prevent pigeons from getting to food waste.



Do not feed pigeons and please discourage people from feeding pigeons.

Feeding pigeons is an offence that carries a fine of up to \$500.

People who throw food from their HDB unit may also be prosecuted for high-rise littering.



Prevent the roosting and nesting of pigeons by installing spikes or other bird-proofing measures.
