

Floral Walk

A welcoming gateway that leads visitors into HortPark, featuring a range of heliconia, ginger and banana plants that produce flamboyant flowers often used for flower arrangements.


Beginner Friendly Garden

Discover a curated selection of low-maintenance, resilient starter plants – from edible and fragrant shrubs to ornamental varieties, climbers, and compact treelets.



My Backyard Kitchen

Based on the idea of being an extension of a kitchen, this series of gardens showcases edibles that can be used for teatime snacks, desserts and beverages.



Scented Garden

Step into a sanctuary filled with delightful scents of blooming flowers and aromatic plants, especially prominent in the evenings as you watch the garden transform from day to night.



Horticulture Introduction Garden

Sourced from around the globe, meet novel and uncommon plant cultivars rarely seen in our local greenery! This garden features emerging new plant cultivars, and specimens with exceptional traits.



Pitter Patter Potter Garden

Mirrored after the primary school's social and natural science curricula, this 'Classroom in a Garden' is for learning about seed dispersal methods.



Native Garden

Populated with plant species native to Singapore, showcasing how these are used – as medicine, feed, timber or to enhance habitats for birds and butterflies.



Valley of Edibles

Take in the sights and smells of common and exotic edible plants in the Edible Garden. Comprising fruit and vegetable plots, it demonstrates that edible gardens can be functional, educational and attractive.



Allotment Garden

The Allotment Garden comprises 2.5 m x 1 m raised planter beds rented out to members of the public who wish to nurture their green fingers. Equipped with built-in storage and nearby water points, each plot can be leased for three years.



Therapeutic Garden

Based on evidence-based design principles related to mental well-being enhancement, this garden uses attractive colours, interesting textures and sounds of nature to intrigue and invigorate visitors.



Butterfly Garden

This garden is planted with suitable nectar and host plants for breeding a variety of butterflies, including those deemed to be vulnerable. Visitors can also learn about the importance of butterflies in our local ecosystem.



Nature Playgarden

Providing children with opportunities to connect with nature while playing and exploring in a natural habitat, this less structured environment and curated play features encourage spontaneous, child-directed play.
