as a responsible
dog owner:

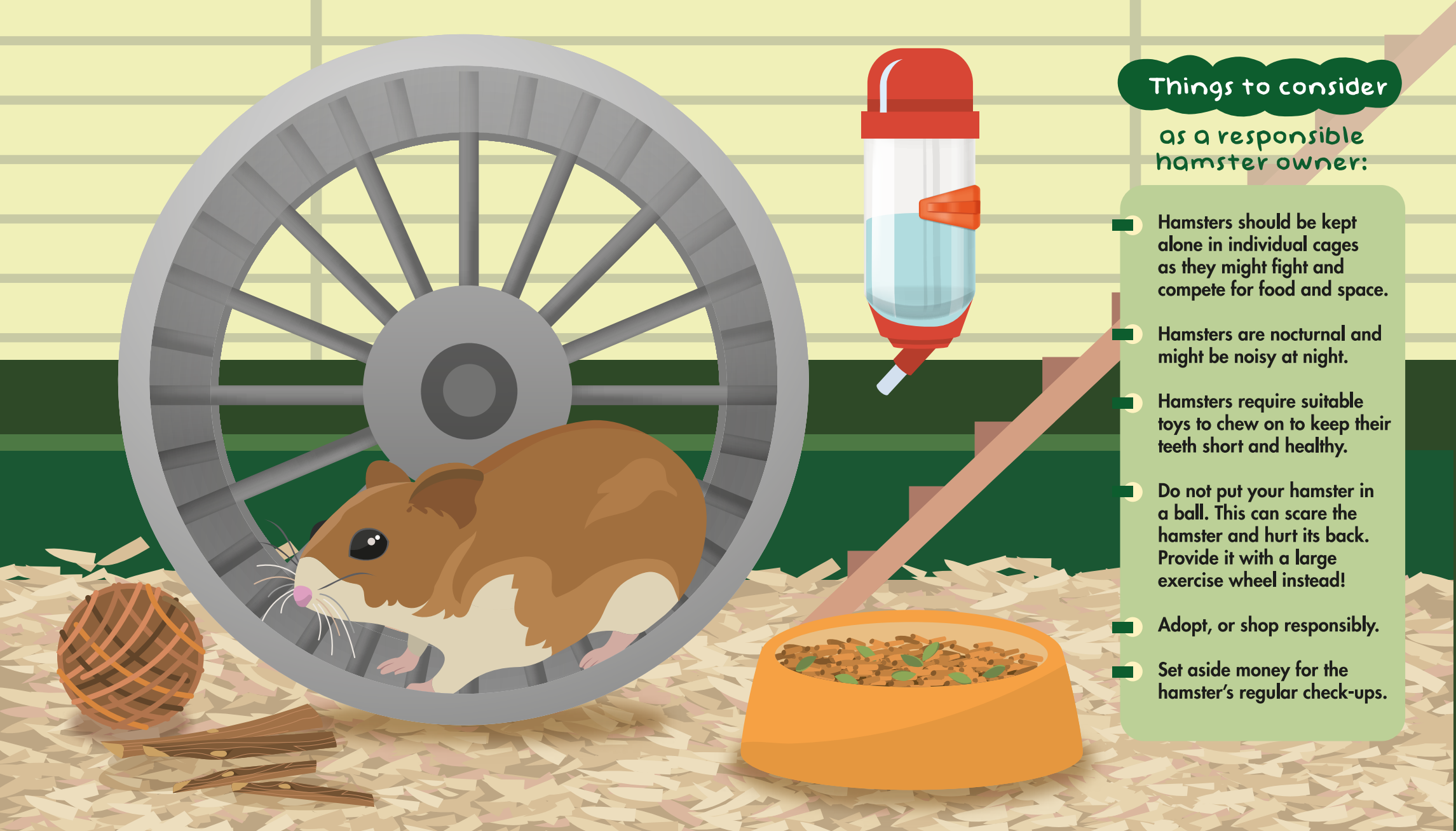
- Dogs must be leashed in public areas.
- Clean up after your dog. Bag poop and dispose it into the bin.
- Adopt, or shop responsibly.
- Set aside money for the dog's vaccination, regular check-ups and training.
- Learn how to read a dog's body language.
- Always ask the owner for permission before patting their dog.



Things to consider

as a responsible cat owner:

- Mesh your main door and windows to keep your cat from falling out.
- Keep your cat indoors at all times and provide scratch posts for enrichment.
- Learn how to read a cat's body language.
- Adopt, or shop responsibly.
- Set aside money for the cat's vaccination and regular check-ups.
- Always ask the owner for permission before patting their cat.



Things to consider

as a responsible
hamster owner:

- Hamsters should be kept alone in individual cages as they might fight and compete for food and space.
- Hamsters are nocturnal and might be noisy at night.
- Hamsters require suitable toys to chew on to keep their teeth short and healthy.
- Do not put your hamster in a ball. This can scare the hamster and hurt its back. Provide it with a large exercise wheel instead!
- Adopt, or shop responsibly.
- Set aside money for the hamster's regular check-ups.



Things to consider

as a responsible rabbit owner:

- Make sure you have enough indoor space for your rabbit's playpen.
- Rabbits require a well-balanced diet of mainly hay. Treats, such as carrots, should be given in moderation to prevent digestive issues.
- Learn how to read a rabbit's body language.
- Adopt, or shop responsibly.
- Be prepared to set aside money for the rabbit's regular check-ups.
- Always ask the owner for permission before patting their rabbit.

Things to consider

as a responsible
terrapiin owner:

- Terrapins can live for 20 to 30 years and grow up to 28 cm! Think carefully before getting one.
- Terrapins require sunlight or UV lamps to keep their shells, skin and bones healthy.
- Adopt, or shop responsibly.
- Wash your hands before and after touching your pet as terrapins can carry *Salmonella* bacteria.
- Set aside money for the terrapiin's regular medical check-ups.
- It is illegal and cruel to release your terrapiin into any water body. Do not abandon your pet.
