



Sweet Traditions: The Resilient Story of the Sweet Potato

1 May| 10am - 12pm | Function Hall, Fort Canning Centre

Attendees will receive a recipe card featuring sweet potato dishes inspired by Singapore's culinary heritage, along with insights into Fort Canning's history. This workshop offers a meaningful blend of history, tradition, and hands-on creativity, ensuring the sweet potato's legacy and the stories of Fort Canning Park continue to inspire and endure.

A Taste of the Ancient Garden 17 May| 10am - 12pm | Function Hall, Fort Canning Centre

Once the site of royal Malay palaces, this iconic hill was home to lush gardens where fruit trees such as durian, rambutan, starfruit, and duku grew in abundance, symbolising prosperity and tranquility.

This cooking demonstration brings these historic fruits to life with a flavourful Indian heritage twist. From using starfruit in refreshing chutneys to crafting a unique dessert with rambutan and coconut, the session reimagines how these fruits can be transformed into creative dishes that celebrate cultural traditions while adding a contemporary touch.

Participants will receive thoughtfully crafted recipe cards, each paired with a note on the history of Fort Canning Park and the cultural significance of the featured ingredients, creating a meaningful connection to the park's heritage and the region's culinary traditions.



WORKSHOPS



Moss, Mould & Monument: A Microcosm-Making Lab

24 May| 10am - 12pm | Function Hall, Fort Canning Centre

Step into the layered history of Fort Canning Park through the quiet lens of moss. Inspired by the delicate micro-ecologies that have taken root on the park's old fort walls, gravestones, and stairways, this hands-on workshop invites participants to craft their own miniature moss monument—where time, nature, and memory intertwine.


Led by a botanist and moss specialist, Dr Ho Boon Chuan, the session begins with a look at how moss slowly grow on aged stone, reclaiming built structures in the tropical climate. These gentle growths are more than decoration—they are living archives of weather, touch, and stillness.

Drawing from the textures of the hill's colonial and royal past, participants will then create their own living microcosm to take home, accompanied by care notes and reflections. This workshop offers a poetic way to explore how nature softens the marks of time—and how something quiet and green can keep history alive.

Crafting Botanical Soap and Spice Garden Tour

24 May| 10am - 12pm, 2pm - 4pm | Lewin Terrace, Fort Canning Park

Join us for a delightful workshop that combines natural crafting with a sensory garden experience! Begin with a guided tour through Fort Canning Park's very own spice garden, where you'll discover local herbs and spices used in traditional remedies and cooking. Then, learn to create your own biodegradable liquid soap using soap berries (Sapindus mukorossi)—nature's sustainable cleaning solution. In this hands—on session, you'll craft your own liquid soap, understand the properties of soap berries, and personalise your creation with essential oils derived from plants you've just explored in the Spice Garden.







Echo Pavilion 1 – 25 May | Fort Gate Lawn, Fort Canning Park

Echo Pavillion is an immersive installation celebrating Fort Canning Park's layered history. Once known as Bukit Larangan, the hill was home to 14th-century Malay royalty tied to the Majapahit Empire. Artefacts like Javanese gold ornaments reflect its cultural and political significance. During the colonial era, it became a symbol of resilience, housing fortifications and Singapore's first botanical garden in 1822. Here, spices like nutmeg and clove, once as valuable as gold, marked Singapore's role in the global spice trade.

Echo Pavillion embodies this history using sustainable materials like woven fibres, fishing nets, and dried fronds, connecting the past to contemporary environmental awareness. Hanging spices evoke the nearby spice garden, while fishing net hammocks cradle visitors, offering a space for reflection. This aromatic and tactile installation invites visitors to honour Fort Canning's legacy of resilience, adaptation, and renewal, bridging its storied past with a sustainable future.



Portals


Now - 29 June | Battlebox, Fort Canning Park

Portals is a new visual art exhibition bridging Singapore's wartime history with creative technology. Set within the historic Battlebox, Portals showcase new works by seven Singapore-based artists. Portals explore the potential for technology and its systems to be agents of change, reclaiming power and place.

Portals is open from 28 March - 29 June 2025, on Wednesdays to Sundays (10am - 5pm, last admission at 4pm). Tickets are found here.

Portals is produced by Global Cultural Alliance, as part of cmd.exe ('command prompt') - a new future-oriented platform that explores how the digital has prompted artmaking.
