SKYRISE GREENERY TRAIL ETIQUETTE

Please observe the following etiquette when visiting the projects listed in this map:

For projects that are listed as “Viewable from street level”, please enjoy the installations from the common/public spaces at street level. You are not allowed to enter the premises without permission.

For projects that are listed as “Walk on me”, these projects are fully accessible to the public.

At each site do remember to take nothing but photos, leave nothing but footprints!

DIFFICULTY OF TRAIL

The trails are of easy to moderate levels. You may alight at the nearest MRT station and walk (unless stated otherwise) to the various projects listed

ESTIMATED TIME OF COMPLETION OF THIS TRAIL

You will take about 3–4 hours to complete this trail. It is possible to complete all projects on foot within this time frame, excluding viewing time at each site.


WHAT IS SKYRISE GREENERY?

Skyrise Greenery is a term coined in Singapore that refers to the greening of both horizontal (rooftop greenery) and vertical (green walls) dimensions.

These installations can be spotted all around Singapore in various forms such as sky terraces, balcony planters, green roofs, rooftop gardens and different types of green walls.

WHY IS SKYRISE GREENING NECESSARY?

In our heavily built-up city-state with limited land, skyrise greenery helps to create a harmonious balance between urban development and our natural heritage. It also helps reduce the Urban Heat Island effect, making Singapore a more liveable place.



01. MARINA SOUTH PIER



A sloping lawn of greenery can be found on the topmost deck of this pier. It features a unique design whereby plants are used to form the letters “M P A”, which stands for “Maritime and Port Authority of Singapore”. The Marina South Pier is owned and maintained by MPA, the agency responsible for the overall development and growth of the port of Singapore. Visitors to this green roof will be treated to panoramic views of the port and the South China Sea.

02. MARINA BARRAGE



Located on Singapore’s first urban water reservoir, this extensive green roof is a favourite spot for outdoor activities, such as picnics or kite-flying. Visitors to this green roof will also be able to enjoy breathtaking views of the South China Sea and the city skyline.

03. GARDENS BY THE BAY



Though not evident at first glance, an extensive roof deck garden exists above the Supertree Dining area of the Gardens. This roof deck garden helps blend the dining area seamlessly into the themed gardens around it. In addition, there are 18 Supertrees, ranging from 25 to 50 metres in height. Iconic vertical gardens, most of the Supertrees are located at the Supertree Grove.

04. ESPLANADE THEATRES ON THE BAY



Located on the topmost floor of the retail mall, this lush rooftop garden can be enjoyed by the public as well as patrons of the rooftop restaurant. Visitors to this garden will be treated to panoramic views of the Marina Bay area while relaxing amid the greenery.

05. SINGAPORE FLYER CARPARK



This publicly accessible rooftop garden boasts lush planting and a recreational space for visitors to the Singapore Flyer. This rooftop garden can be found at the topmost level of the multistorey carpark block and is linked to the second floor of the Singapore Flyer building by a bridge.

07. SINGAPORE SPORTS HUB



Various rooftop gardens with sloping green mounts mimicking its domes can be found throughout the Sports Hub. You may wish to visit the garden on the third floor of Kallang Wave Mall, which is accessible to the public. Segments of vertical greenery can also be seen on the carpark façade, providing a continuous green cover throughout the Hub.

06. F1 PIT BUILDING



Several strips of vertical greenery panels, spanning three storeys each, can be found along the façade facing the main road. They are best viewed from afar at the pedestrian walkway. These segments of greenery provide relief and break up the harshness of the continuous white concrete façade.
